Objective of This Explanatory Technical Note

This explanatory technical note provides supplementary notes on the strengths and limitations of each Common Operational Dataset on Population Statistics (COD-PS) against the projections by the WPP 2022 Revision of the UN to enable informed humanitarian decision-making.

General Notes	<p>The resident population in this COD-PS is derived from the Address Based Population Registration System (ABPRS), as part of the country's register-based census undertaken in 2021. It closely aligns the country's civil registration data, administrative migration data and address register. It therefore provides a data-driven accounting of population dynamics, avoiding heavy reliance on assumptions about future fertility, mortality and migration in the aftermath of a traditional population and housing census. ABPRS does not include information on Turkish citizens abroad as well as foreigners holding visas or residence permits shorter than 3 months with the purpose of training, tourism, scientific research, etc. Furthermore, this COD-PS includes the district (ADM-2) level estimates of the 3,500,964 Syrians under temporary protection (as of 03 February 2023) using the best information available at the time of building this COD-PS. Note that, according to the Ministry of Interior, only 1.36% of them (47,467) live in temporary accommodation centers [informally known as 'camps']. Due to the lack of information, this COD-PS does not include refugees or refugee-like people from countries other than Syria.</p>
Data Limitations	<p>Per its architecture, refugees under temporary protection are not included in the ABPRS. This COD-PS includes the population estimates of Syrians under temporary protection at the district (ADM-2) level, but the estimates may not be accurate in some areas. It is because the ADM-2 estimates of Syrians were derived using the best information available at the time: (1) sex and age disaggregation at the national (ADM-0) level, (2) subnational geographic distribution at the provincial (ADM-1) level, and (3) proportion of district (ADM-2) resident populations to their respective provincial (ADM-1) populations. For example, the estimated number of Syrians under temporary protection in the district of Elbeyli in this COD-PS is 3,306, but it should be a minimum of 7,393 residing in the camps as of 03 February 2023. But the numbers of Syrians under temporary protection in 5 other districts of this COD-PS were checked and revealed to exceed the populations in the camps in these districts [Altinozu: 12,693 - greater than 3,975 in camps, Yayladagi: 7,741 - greater than 3,141 in camps, Dulkadiroglu: 17,621 - greater than 9,691 in camps, Yayladagi: 19,534 -</p>

COD-PS Demographic Data Quality Assessment	The COD-PS was assessed against ADM-0 estimates and projections published by the World Population Prospects (2022 Revision) from the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN-DESA), the Ministry of Interior information on Syrians living under temporary protection, and UNHCR Data Finder on refugee and refugee-like populations. This COD-PS was also checked against a report from the Global Task Force on Migration, 'Global Compact on Refugees: Good Practices & Innovative Approaches by Cities', for spot-checking the aggregate number of refugees in the districts where information was available within the report.

Methodology Used	The subnational resident population of Türkiye within this COD-PS comes from the results of the Address-Based Population Registration System (ABPRS) as of 31 December 2022. ABPRS was first established in 2007 to obtain updated information on the size and characteristics of the population by localities and to follow population movements regularly. Since then, annual registry-based censuses using ABPRS has replaced the traditional and combined censuses. The Syrian population under temporary protection within this COD-PS comes from the official figures of the Ministry of Interior as of 03 February 2023. To estimate their sex and age disaggregated distribution at the district (ADM-2) level with the best information available, first, their sex and age disaggregation at the national (ADM-0) level was applied uniformly to their subnational geographic distribution at the provincial (ADM-1) level. Then, the provincial (ADM-1) level sex and age disaggregated estimates of Syrians under temporary protection were further split by the proportions of district (ADM-2) resident populations to their respective provincial (ADM-1) populations, because there was no sufficient or systematic information available for the Syrians under temporary protection at the district (ADM-2) level.

3. Intrinsic Population Growth Rates (ADM-0 & 1) [Excluding Syrians under temporary protection]

At ADM-0, the postcensal (2021–2022) population growth rates of this COD-PS (0.71% per year: female 0.76%, male 0.65%) are generally consistent with the growth rates of the UN's population projections published in WPP 2022 (2020: 0.77% per year, 2021: 0.75% per year, 2022: 0.59% per year).

During the postcensal period, the northern province of Gumushane experienced the lowest population growth (–3.79% per year: female –3.52%, male –4.05%), followed by four northeastern provinces bordering Georgia and Armenia: Ardahan (–2.62%: female –2.72%, male –2.52%), Kars (–2.24%: female –1.90%, male –2.58%), Mus (–1.50%: female –1.50%, male –1.49%), and Agri (–2.70%: female –2.64%, male –2.77%). In the same period, 10 provinces in the north-western parts of the country experienced the highest rates of population growths.

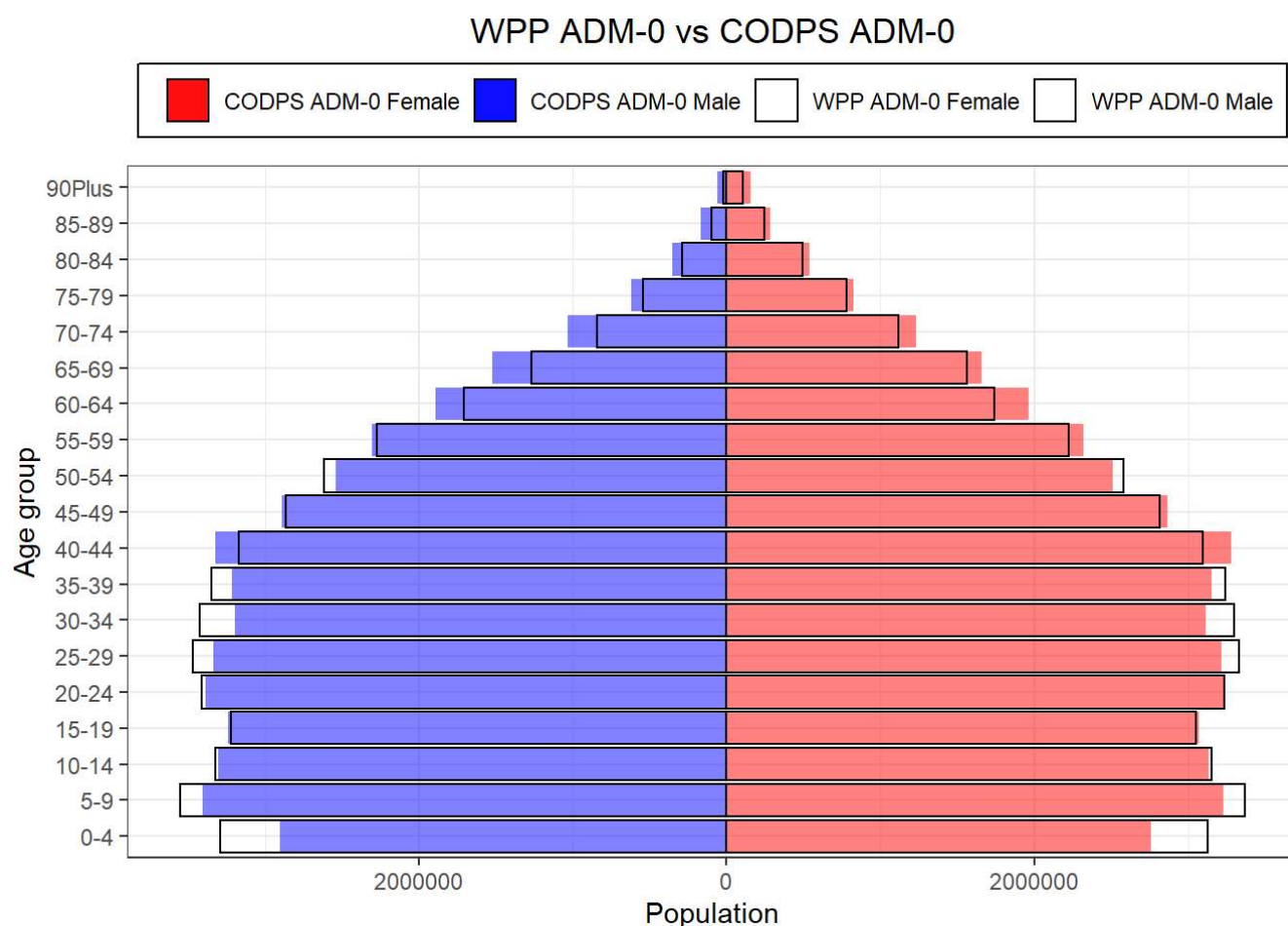

4. Population Counts by age and sex (ADM-0) [Excluding Syrians under temporary protection]

Below, we compare the population structure across sex and age groups between the NSO estimates and WPP projections at the national level. At ADM-0, the age- and sex-specific population counts of this COD-PS are somewhat consistent with the WPP 2022 projection, with the greatest differences among those aged 0-4 years (NSO < WPP by female -11.85%, male -11.75%).

5. Relative population size by age and sex (ADM-1) [Excluding Syrians under temporary protection]

Below, we compare the relative population proportions for 5-year age groups by sex between the NSO ADM-1 estimates and the WPP ADM-0 projection. The majority of the provinces show low fertility and high degree of ageing. There is a handful of provinces showing high fertility: Agri, Batman, Bitlis, Diyarbakir, Gaziantep, Igdir, Kilis, Mardin, Mus, Sanliurfa, Siirt, Sirnak, and Van. There are some provinces which display relatively higher proportions of young adults in their 20s: Bayburt, Bilecik, Burdur, Cannakale, Erzincan, Gumushane, Hakkari, Isparta, Karabuk, and Tunceli.
