

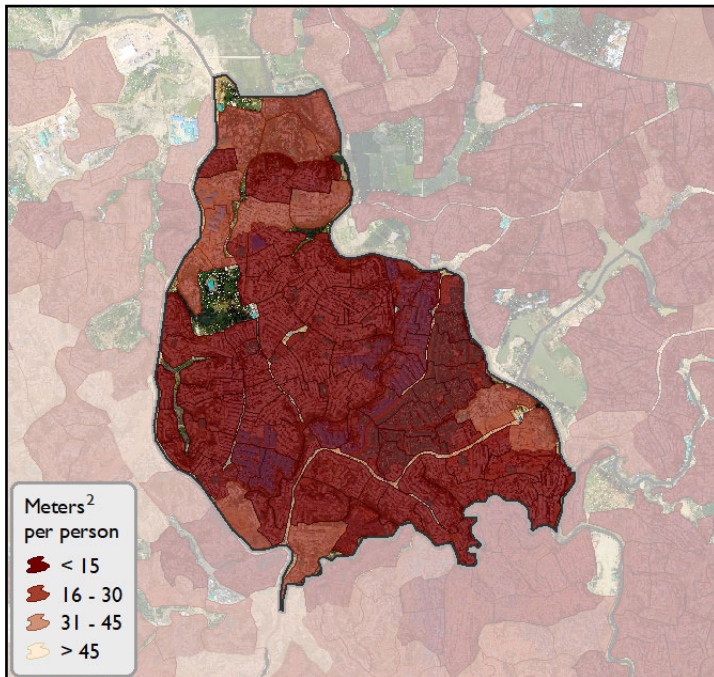

CONTEXT AND METHODOLOGY

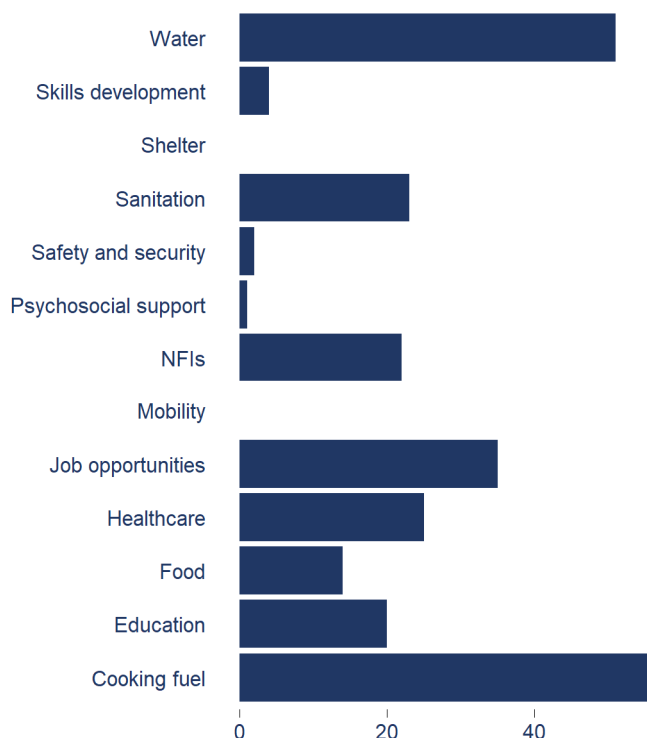
IOM Bangladesh Needs and Population Monitoring (NPM) regularly and systematically captures and disseminates information regarding the movements and evolving needs of populations on the move, whether on site or en route.

NPM's Site Assessment rounds capture the numbers, locations and key sectoral needs of Rohingya refugees in the areas affected by the influx since August 2017.

Data is collected through quantitative key informant interviews and direct observation. This is followed by a qualitative component that involves interviews with different categories of key informants, including Camp Managers, Camp Committee and Governance bodies, and female specific interviews. The unit of data collection depends on the context. In collective sites, the unit is a 'block,' defined as an area of responsibility of one majhee, a community leader. In dispersed sites, the geographical unit of reference is the village. These units are collectively referred to as 'locations' in this Site Profile. The data are aggregated and reported at the camp level in collective sites.

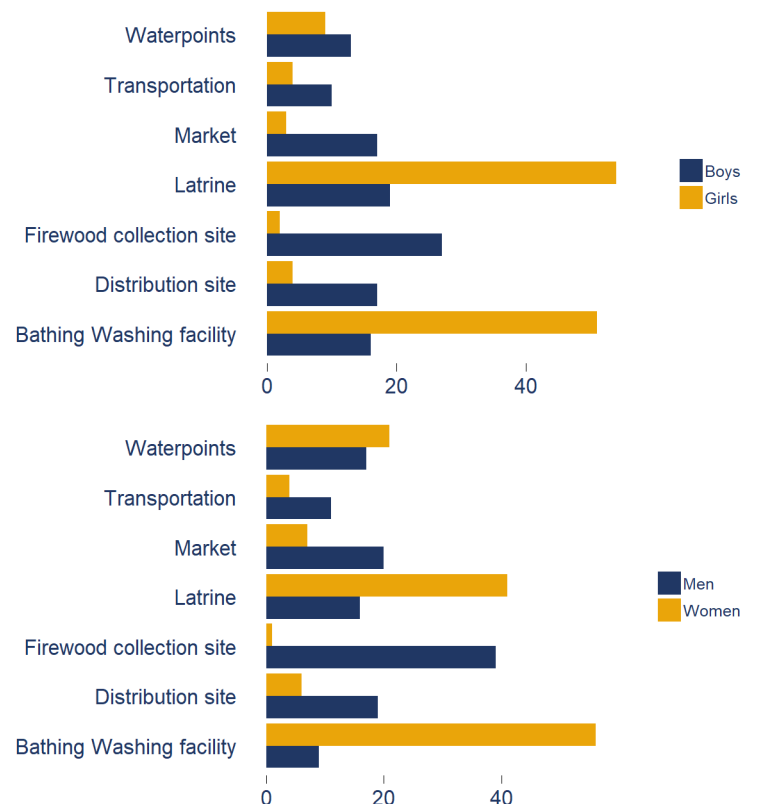

ACCESS TO EDUCATION BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS

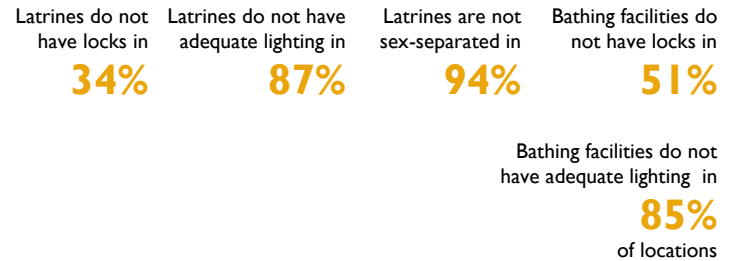
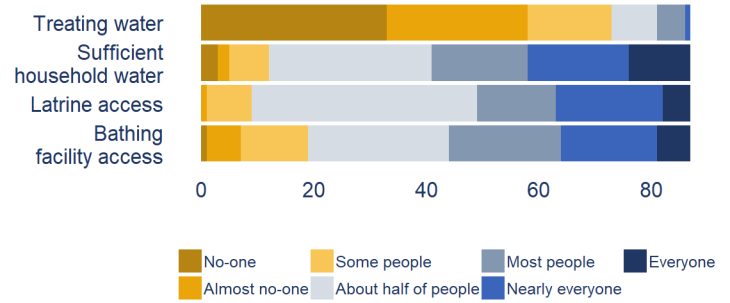


ISSUES PREVENTING EDUCATION ACCESS BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS



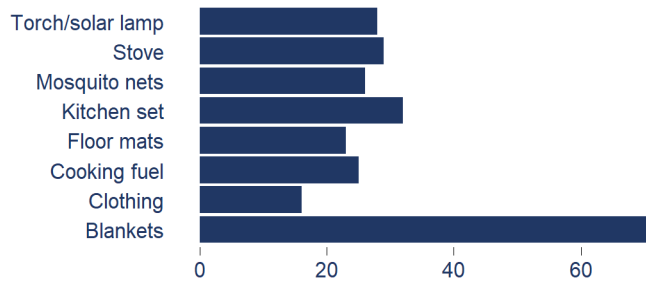

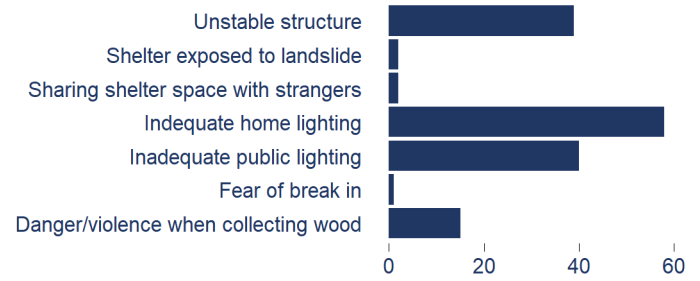

REPORTED URGENT FAMILY NEEDS BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS

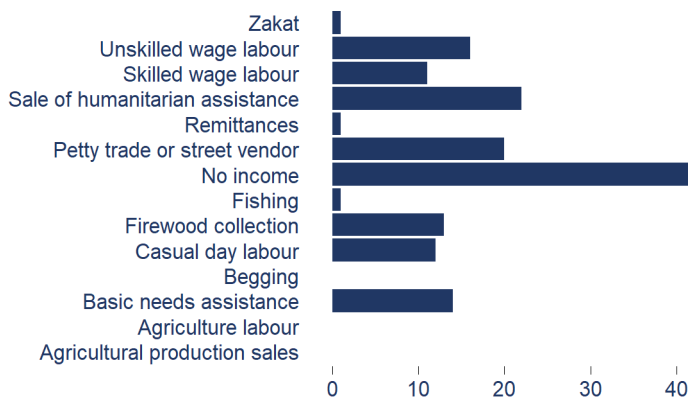


MOST COMMONLY REPORTED SAFETY / SECURITY CONCERNS BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS

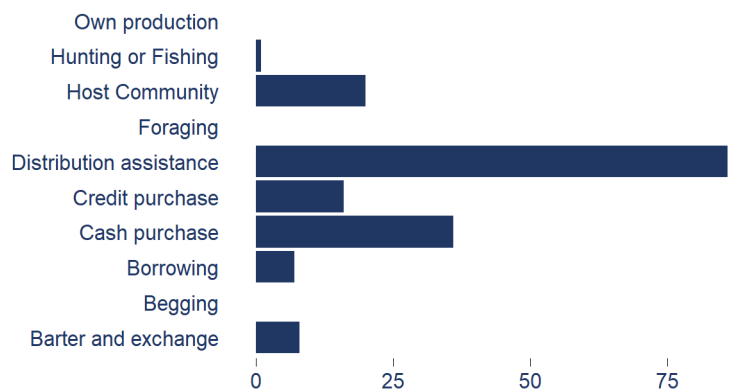


FOOD, NUTRITION & LIVELIHOOD

MAIN INCOME SOURCE BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS



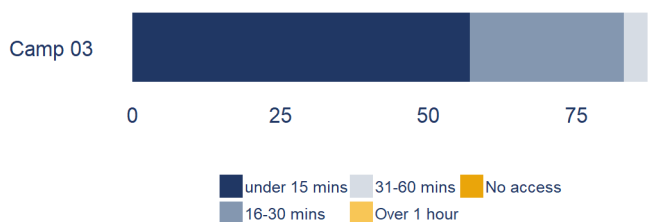
MAIN FOOD SOURCE BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS



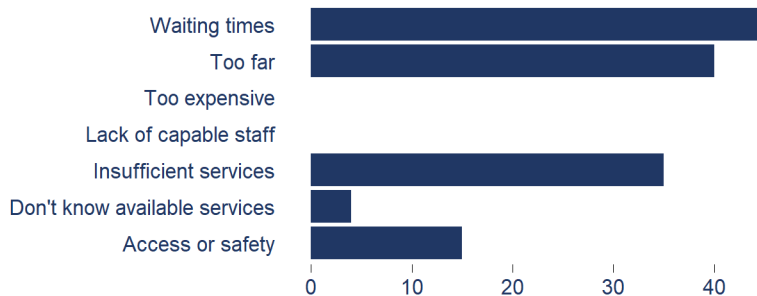
PROPORTION OF FAMILIES EATING ONLY ONE MEAL PER DAY



NEAREST HEALTH FACILITY BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS

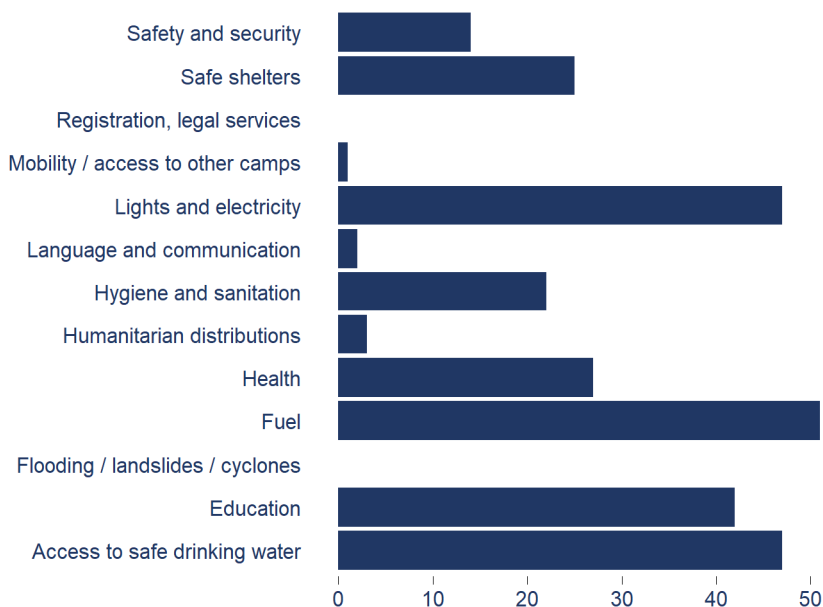


HEALTH CARE CHALLENGES BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS

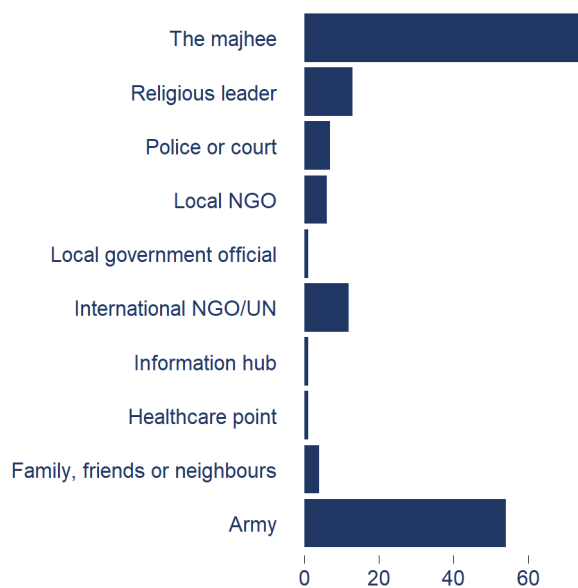

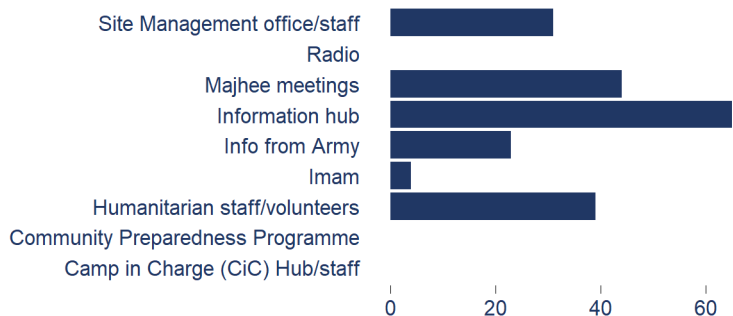
TOP COMMUNITY CONCERNS BY NUMBER OF LOCATIONS
